Host City: Kochi & Kerala

Kochi (also known as **Cochin**), fondly called the *“Queen of the Arabian Sea”*, is a historic port city that has welcomed travelers and traders from across the world for centuries. A vibrant blend of heritage and modernity, Kochi is known for its iconic Chinese fishing nets, colonial architecture, bustling spice markets, and thriving arts and cultural scene.

The logo of the 23rd International Congress of Arachnology combines symbolic elements that reflect the identity and culture of the host city. This ship emphasizes Kochi's vibrant role as a gateway for trade and cultural exchange. The palm tree on the left represents the state of Kerala, often referred to as the "Land of Coconuts." The state's name is derived from "Keram," meaning coconut palm in Malayalam language, which highlights Kerala's rich connection to coconut palms, its lush landscapes, and its agricultural prominence, justifying its epithet as "God's Own Country." At the center, a stylized spider web focuses on the congress's arachnological theme. The colors saffron, white, and green at the bottom reflect the Indian national flag, symbolizing the congress's location in India and its connection to the broader Indian identity. Thus, the logo blends Kochi's maritime legacy, Kerala's natural beauty, and India's national identity with the scientific focus of the International Congress of Arachnology.

Visa Information

All international delegates traveling to India will require a valid visa. India offers a convenient e-Visa facility for citizens of most countries, which can be applied for online. The conference visa category is applicable for participation in scientific congresses. Hence, it is mandatory that all participants, except accompanying persons, must apply for the conference visa.

We recommend initiating the visa application process well in advance, as processing times may vary depending on the country of residence. The congress organizers will provide official invitation letters to registered delegates upon request, to assist with visa formalities. Detailed instructions and guidance will be made available on the congress website.

Excursions and Tours

Delegates will have the opportunity to participate in a variety of enriching excursions. The mid-congress excursion will offer a choice between a guided biodiversity field trip to the majestic Western Ghats or a serene houseboat cruise through the iconic Kerala backwaters. In addition, optional pre- and post-congress tours will allow participants to further explore Kerala's extraordinary natural and cultural heritage. Highlights include visits to the lush Munnar tea gardens, the wildlife-rich Periyar Tiger Reserve, the breathtaking Athirappilly Waterfalls, the tranquil Alappuzha backwaters, and immersive experiences in Kerala's world-renowned Ayurveda wellness traditions. For those seeking coastal beauty, excursions will also feature some of the most famous beaches of South and Central Kerala, including Varkala with its dramatic cliffs, Kovalam known for its crescent-shaped shores, and Marari with its pristine golden sands, offering delegates a chance to experience Kerala's scenic coastline and vibrant seaside culture.

Accompanying persons' activities include heritage walks, cultural immersion activities, cooking classes, and Ayurveda and wellness experiences, etc.

Specimen Collection in India

Foreign individuals or entities intending to access, use, or obtain biological resources and associated knowledge from India are required to obtain prior approval from the National Biodiversity Authority (NBA) under the provisions of

the Biological Diversity Act (BDA), 2002. The NBA is mandated to regulate access to biological resources and/or associated knowledge for a range of activities, including research, bio-survey and bio-utilization, commercial utilization, securing intellectual property rights, transferring research results, and transferring accessed biological resources. Applications may be submitted by non-Indians, NRIs, foreign entities, or Indian entities with foreign participation in their share capital or management. In addition to NBA approval, prior permission from the State Forest Departments and State Biodiversity Boards is mandatory for specimen collection within the respective states. Compliance with these legal requirements is essential, and delegates are strongly advised to initiate the process well in advance of their intended activities.

Registration Fee in USD (18% GST Inclusive)

Registration fee includes: Airport pick-up and drop, Welcome Reception, lunch on all congress days, coffee breaks, mid-congress excursion, conference kit, and Congress Dinner. For accompanying persons, the fee covers the Welcome Reception, mid-congress excursion, specially curated activities such as guided city tours, heritage walks, cultural immersion experiences etc., and the Congress Dinner.

Accessibility and Local Transport

Kochi is well-connected by air, rail, and road. The Cochin International Airport (COK), located about 25 km from the city center, offers direct connections to major international hubs in Asia, the Middle East, and Europe. Regular trains link Kochi (Ernakulam Town and Junction Stations) to other Indian cities. Within the city, participants can use taxis, app-based cab services, buses, and the modern Kochi Metro for convenient transport.

Accommodation

A limited number of rooms will be available at **special rates at the congress venue (Gokulam Park Hotel and Convention Centre)**. These will be allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. Booking details will be available on the congress website. Additional options include luxury hotels, boutique stays, and budget accommodations nearby. Delegates may also book through trusted online platforms such as Booking.com, Trip.com, Agoda, and MakeMyTrip.

Climate Information

During November, Kochi experiences pleasant tropical weather, making it an ideal time to host the congress. Daytime temperatures typically range between 24–33°C, with comfortable evenings. As the southwest monsoon season ends by October, the skies are generally clear; however, occasional light showers can still be expected. Delegates are advised to carry an umbrella or raincoat for possible showers.

Call for Symposia and Short-Course Proposals

We invite proposals for symposia and short courses to be held during the congress. Symposia proposals should include the symposium title, names and affiliations of conveners (one to three), a brief description of approximately 250 words outlining the scope and objectives, and, where possible, a list of potential speakers. Symposia should typically have a duration of 90 minutes and 4-5 speakers.

Short courses may last from one to four days, scheduled immediately before or after the congress, and proposals should indicate the title, coordinator(s), tentative program and schedule, learning objectives and maximum participants.

Proposals for both symposia and short courses should be submitted by 31 October 2025 by email to the Organizing Committee at ica2026kochi@gmail.com, with the subject line clearly indicating whether it is a symposium or short-course proposal. All submissions will be reviewed by the Scientific Committee, and accepted sessions will be announced in the Second Circular (November/December 2025). Coordinators will be responsible for finalizing content, arranging invited speakers or instructors, and coordinating logistics with the Organizing Committee.
